Greetings PHHS Families,

Marking Period 3 Report Cards will be available at 4:00 PM today in FOCUS. Hard copies of Report Cards will be delivered to students in Period 1A tomorrow, April 16th. Please take time to review your child's progress and set goals to finish strong in Marking Period 4. As you set goals with students, know that Cumulative GPA is based on final grades; Fall Athletics eligibility is based on MP4 grades – students must have a 2.0 GPA and no more than one E to be eligible for athletics. Attendance matters! Finish strong, Gators!

Dress for Success – PHHS is scheduled to switch from heating to cooling this week. Temperatures will vary from warm to cool in different parts of the building and throughout the day. Students are encouraged to dress in comfortable layers, keeping in mind the school atmosphere is dignified by respectful dress which promotes educational and career success. MCAP Testing –Students enrolled in courses listed below will take the state assessment (MCAP) for each course during their scheduled class time whenever possible. Students must take the MCAP to fulfill graduation requirements, and performance on the MCAP is counted as the FINAL EXAM Grade. Achievement on the MCAP is also factored in College & Career Readiness standards for which students may receive free access to college courses.

Virtual Learning Program for 2024-2025 School Year – Application Now Open – The application for the 2024-2025 BCPS Online Learning Program is now available on the Department of Academic Programs and Options website. Applications must be submitted by 1 p.m. on May 3, 2024. Students must be entering grade 4 – 12 in SY 24-25. Current VLP students do NOT need to reapply.

Enrollment in the BCPS Online Learning Program is limited to students eligible for enrollment in BCPS as defined in Board of Education Policy and Superintendent's Rule 5150. All applicants are selected for placement through a centralized random lottery process. All applicants receive email notification of



their admissions status from the BCPS Online Learning Program. Admission decisions for all applicants will be released by May 24, 2024.

TICKETING

ENTRANCE/EXIT RULES

ALL EVENTS ARE PAY AND STAY; THERE IS NO RE-ENTRY. BATHROOMS ARE ON THE GYM LEVEL NEXT TO THE Locker Rooms. No one is allowed in the main school building. All spectators must exit through the back doors.



UPDATE FOR STUDENTS INTERESTED IN FALL OR SUMMER CCBC COURSES AT CCBC OR ONLINE

The registration process for CCBC courses begins with a meeting with Mrs. Wienhold at PHHS. After meeting/discussing your course plans and applying to CCBC with Mrs. Wienhold, you will receive a link to access the ECAP Form (links must be shared from school to student).

Please note that there **will be a cost for ALL summer courses** at CCBC. Rising Juniors and Seniors who are planning to take courses in the FALL **MAY** qualify for Tuition–Free courses (4) at CCBC IF they meet the CCR Status (meet with Mrs. Wienhold for details).

Please review the following guidelines from CCBC for completing the REGISTRATION PROCESS and CCBC ECAP form:


- Students must apply to CCBC prior to completing the ECAP consent form.
- Students will need their CCBC ID# to plug into the form. Once plugged in, the top portion of the form will self-populate with student personal information.
- All fields that have an asterisk must be completed.
- BCPS students need to see Ms. Wienhold to get the link to the electronic ECAP form. This is being done so that she can let students know if they qualify as College and Career Ready (CCR) prior to registration.
- If student answers from drop down menu that "YES" they attend a Baltimore County high school, the language at the bottom of the form changes. If student answers "NO" that they do not attend a Baltimore County high school, the language at the bottom of the form changes to detail PEP 50% reduction in tuition rate, etc.
- 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students must attach their high school transcript to the ECAP consent form. 9th grade students are asked to attach a copy of their latest report card. Attaching a transcript/report card is a required field.
- Student signs the form



Counseling-cont'd

- Student enters first name, last name, and email address of parent/guardian.
- Student receives a confirmation email that they have completed their portion of the form, and the form has been sent to their parent for signature.
- Parent receives an email requesting their signature on the form. They will be asked to set-up an account. Once the parent signs the form, they will receive a confirmation email that the form has been sent forward for processing.
- ECAP Office staff receive an email that an ECAP form is awaiting approval. ECAP Office electronically signs the form.
- Student receives a confirmation email that they may move forward with registration if they have 2.5 or higher GPA. If they are a 9th grade student or have below a 2.5 gpa, Accuplacer testing information is also included in the confirmation email.
