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## *AP Capstone Diplomas*

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The AP Capstone Diploma is an advanced high school diploma program developed by the College Board, the same organization that administers the Advanced Placement (AP) program. It is designed to provide high school students with an opportunity to engage in college-level research, writing, and critical thinking skills.

To earn the AP Capstone Diploma, students must successfully complete both AP Seminar and AP Research, as well as four additional AP courses of their choice and earn a score of 3 or higher on the AP exams for those courses.

Last year, only 15,800 students in the world earned the AP Capstone Diploma. Here are our diploma recipients for 2023. Post-secondary plans are included for graduates.

*AP Testing*

**Information about AP Testing/ Opting out deadline**

**Q: If the test is free, when/why would I be charged a fee?**

A. When a student joins AP classroom they are automatically registered for the AP Exam for that course. If a student wishes to opt out (not take the exam) they need to email Ms. Fischer [afischer@bcps.org](mailto:afischer@bcps.org) requesting the opt out before November 1st. Students (and their AP teacher) will receive a message back confirming the opting out. If a student doesn't receive a confirmation from Ms. Fischer they should reach out again (check the spelling of the email: [afischer@bcps.org](mailto:afischer@bcps.org)). The student and their AP teacher will receive confirmation from Ms. Fischer of the opt out. This also includes students who dropped an AP class. They need to be dropped from the AP Classroom by Nov. 1 to avoid a test being ordered.

Description of Fees associated with AP testing	Cost Per Exam
<p><b>Late order fee (If you opt out and change your mind)</b> Exams ordered between November 1 and March 15 for full-year or first-semester courses incur a late order fee. This fee doesn't pertain to students that transfer into the school.</p>	<p>\$40 per exam</p>
<p><b>Unused/canceled exam fee</b> If you decide after the November ordering deadline not to take an exam that was ordered for you, the charge is \$40 per exam instead of the full exam fee. The \$40 fee applies to any unused or canceled exam, including an exam ordered for a student who qualifies for a College Board fee reduction. It's important to tell your AP coordinator if you decide not to take an exam. Failure to sit for this exam still incurs the \$40 fee. This fee doesn't apply if you transfer out of a school.</p>	<p>\$40 per exam</p>

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## *Athletics-RULES*

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Perry Hall High School is committed to providing a safe and supportive environment for all staff, students and spectators participating in athletic events. Athletic programs positively impact the community, and it is our expectation that student athlete and spectator behaviors reflect our core values of teamwork and sportsmanship. Attendance at athletic events is a privilege.

To ensure Perry Hall events remain safe and family-oriented, we are asking all members of the community to do their part:

- All Tickets will be sold online with [Ticket Spicket](#).
  - For PHHS Football Games: All PHHS student ticket sales will be PRE-SOLD during lunch shifts. NO STUDENT TICKET SALES at the gate; no exceptions.
- All BCPS and school rules apply.
  - All PHHS students must be socially eligible to purchase a ticket and/or attend extra-curricular activities:
    - Academics - no more than one failing grade at the time of the event
    - Attendance - no unexcused absences or class cuts
    - Behavior - students may be socially suspended from events for serious and/or repeated offenses.
- Elementary and middle school students must be accompanied by a parent or guardian for the duration of the event.
- No bags or backpacks permitted.
  - Small clutch bags, no larger than 4.5" x 6.5" (approximately the size of a hand), medically necessary items, and diaper bags may be subject to search prior to entry.
- No Re-entry.
- No loitering on school grounds during or after events.
  - Students or guests loitering on campus will be asked to leave immediately.
  - Students must be picked up promptly at the conclusion of the event.
    - Football games generally last 2 to 2.5 hours.
    - PHHS staff will make repeated announcements for students to arrange transportation near the end of the event.
- Anyone engaging in violent or criminal behavior at an event will be removed from the premises immediately and not be permitted to return to any BCPS campus for athletics or extra-curricular activities for a period of no less than 90 days. Students will be subject to serious school and legal consequences.

## Counseling-Seniors

Attention Senior Families – The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (the FAFSA) is undergoing many changes. Because of this, it will NOT open on October 1st. A final date has not been set but we anticipate that it will open in December. Because of this, we are cancelling our October Financial Aid evening and will reschedule it once we have more details.

Below is a general information sheet. Even though you cannot complete the FAFSA until December, you CAN begin the process by obtaining an FSA ID for students and contributors (parents). That way, when it does open, you are ready to go!

**Big FAFSA<sup>®</sup> changes are here**

Different doesn't mean bad: we've got your back so you don't miss a beat. Completing and submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA<sup>®</sup>) just got easier, but you will want to know about changes too so you're prepared!

**What do you need?**

If you're a dependent student, you'll need this information for you and your parents.

- ✓ You and your parents will need an FSA (Federal Student Aid) ID to access the FAFSA<sup>®</sup> and sign the form electronically. The FSA ID must be obtained at **studentaid.gov** before you start the FAFSA<sup>®</sup>, and we recommend applying 3-5 days before you plan on starting the FAFSA<sup>®</sup>.
- ✓ Your Social Security number
- ✓ Your parents' Social Security numbers
- ✓ **What do you no longer need?** Student and parent tax documents. All of this information will be automatically accessed from the IRS through the FUTURE Act Direct Data Exchange (FADDX).

**Keep in mind that filing the FAFSA<sup>®</sup> is free—you should never be asked to pay to complete the form.**

**If your financial aid status has changed, you must complete the FAFSA<sup>®</sup> with the information required, and then follow up with your school's financial aid office for further advice.**

**To be eligible for federal financial aid, you must file the FAFSA<sup>®</sup> for each year you'll be in school.**
